Full Sun (6+ hours)

Classic meadow builders for open, bright spaces

Black eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia hirta*)
Blue False Indigo (*Baptisia australis*)
Common Milkweed (*Asclepias syriaca*)
Early Goldenrod (*Solidago juncea*)
Indian Grass (*Sorghastrum nutans*)
Lanceleaf Coreopsis (*Coreopsis lanceolata*)
Little Bluestem (*Schizachyrium scoparium*)
Oxeye Sunflower (*Heliopsis helianthoides*)
Purple Coneflower (*Echinacea purpurea*)
Purple Lovegrass (*Eragrostis spectabilis*)
Sundrops (*Oenothera fruticosa*)
Wild Bergamot (*Monarda fistulosa*)

Part Sun / Part Shade

Meadow edges and light woodland transitions

Aromatic Aster (*Symphyotrichum oblongifolium*)
Blue Vervain (*Verbena hastata*)
Boneset (*Eupatorium perfoliatum*)
Flat topped White Aster (*Doellingeria umbellata*)
Mistflower (*Conoclinium coelestinum*)
Narrowleaf Mountain Mint (*Pycnanthemum tenuifolium*)
Ohio Spiderwort (*Tradescantia ohiensis*)
Slender Lespedeza (*Lespedeza virginica*)
Swamp Milkweed (*Asclepias incarnata*)
Tall White Beardtongue (*Penstemon digitalis*)
Virginia Spiderwort (*Tradescantia virginiana*)
Wrinkleleaf Goldenrod (*Solidago rugosa*)

Light Shade to Part Shade

Under trees and north facing areas

Deer Tongue Grass (*Dichanthelium clandestinum*)
Roundseed Panicgrass (*Dichanthelium sphaerocarpon*)
Sensitive Pea (*Chamaecrista nictitans*)
Virginia Wild Rye (*Elymus virginicus*)
